Dear Parents, Students and Members of the Emmanuel Catholic College Community,

I would like to welcome all students back to school from their vacation and trust that they are feeling refreshed and ready to commence Term Two with a spirit of determination and enthusiasm. Over the vacation, I looked over the Term One Reports and was delighted to see many students across the different year groups achieving interim results that are especially pleasing. Merit certificates will soon be presented to these students.

At our whole College assembly on Wednesday, a number of students were acknowledged and presented with awards for various achievements during the course of Term One. It was also an occasion where high achieving students in Years 7-9 who were successful in being selected for our Gifted and Talented Education Programme (GATE) were presented with a badge to recognise this accomplishment. The GATE programme will provide opportunities for these students to be further challenged and extended with their learning. Congratulations are offered to all students who were recognised for their achievements.

Also at our assembly, I reminded students of the importance of wearing their College uniform correctly. I would like to take this opportunity to emphasise that this includes wearing the tie pulled up with the top button done up; boys are required to have their shirt tucked in during Terms Two and Three. 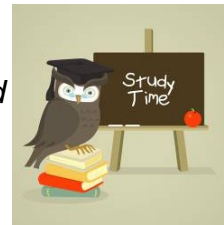

Parents of Year 7 and 9 students should have received an *Information for Parents* pamphlet regarding the National Assessment Program Literacy and Numeracy. As stated previously, students in Years 7 and 9 will complete the nation-wide assessments during the week beginning Monday May 11. Parents are advised that all students need to sit these assessments and families should not plan for students to be absent during this week. Tests can not be completed prior to the nationally allocated test dates or at times after the week of testing.

## **COLLEGE PHOTOGRAPHS**

Parents/guardians and students are reminded that College photographs will be taken on Friday of next week by Academy Photography.

**ECC SPORTING NEWS**

Over the Easter holidays Amy Peterson (Year 9) was selected to play in the Under 14's National Club Championships in Water Polo held in Perth at Challenge Stadium. Amy plays for Melville and there were over 10 other teams from around Australia participating in the Championships. We congratulate Amy as part of the Melville team that finished 3<sup>rd</sup> in the Championships.

Also over the Easter holidays Anna Frisulli (Year 9) competed in the Interschool Equestrian Championships held at the State Equestrian Centre in Brigadoon. Anna competed in the Dressage, Showjumping and the Showman categories. In the Showman category (which consists of a showjumping phase, a rider phase, a dressage phase and horse handling phase) riding on Jules she finished 8<sup>th</sup>, this is a fantastic result as there were over 100 competitors. Anna did extremely well and showed great sportsmanship and is to be congratulated on how she represented the College.

Ethan Giesige (Year 10) has been selected to represent Western Australia to compete in the International Track and Field Championships to be held in Kuala Lumpur from 26<sup>th</sup> June to 3<sup>rd</sup> July 2009. The competition is held between Malaysia/Singapore and Western Australia. We congratulate Ethan on his selection in this team and wish him the best of luck for the Championships.

Madeleine Scott (Year 11) has been selected to represent Australia at the Arafura Games to be held in Darwin in early May. Madeleine will be competing in the 50m breaststroke and freestyle and the 100m butterfly, breaststroke and freestyle. Her selection in this team came about because she performed so well at a recent competition in Sydney in March, where she competed in 7 events and made 5 finals. At these Championships she won bronze medals in the 50m and 100m breaststroke events and a silver medal in the 50m butterfly. Along with all these medals she also broke the world record for her swimming classification. Swimming Australia are only taking a team of 15 swimmers from all over Australia to the Arafura Games, so for Madeleine to be selected is a real honour. All of the Emmanuel Catholic College Community congratulates Madeleine on her recent success and wishes her the best of luck at the Arafura Games later this month.

## YEARS 10, 11 & 12 SEMESTER ONE EXAMINATIONS

### Year 10:

Semester One Examinations for Year 10 students will be held in the period  
**Monday 25 May – Friday 29 May.**

As with students in Years 11 & 12, our Year 10s have been advised that they need to see the forthcoming Semester One Examinations as being most **important**, that they **do count** and that **solid revision and preparation are required** leading up to sitting for them. Students can expect that the examinations will cover work over an extended period of time, such as from Terms One and Two. Teachers will provide more specific details.

Year 10 students should understand that many of the Year 11 courses to be offered for 2010 will have minimum entry requirements with regard to results to be obtained in Year 10, including on the Semester One Report. For a number of the 2010 Year 11 courses, a minimum performance on the Year 10 examinations will be set as a co-requirement to be met.

### Years 11 & 12:

Semester One Examinations for Years 11 & 12 students will be held in the period  
**Tuesday 2 June - Friday 12 June.**

Year 11 students should understand that many of the Year 12 courses to be offered for 2010 will have minimum entry requirements with regard to results to be obtained in Year 11, including on the Semester One Report.

Year 12 students should also be aiming to achieve at their best in order to not only secure their position with regard to meeting the requirements for Secondary Graduation, but also in relation to maximising their chances of gaining entry into university, TAFE or other training programmes.
